



## Investment Objective and Policy

The objective of the Sub-Fund is to generate absolute return over multiple market cycles by combining macroeconomic, fundamental and technical analysis in a style-agnostic approach, with two principal goals, preserving capital and achieving positive return every year.

The Sub-Fund intends to accomplish its investment objective by taking both long and short positions (the latter only via investments in financial derivative instruments) on eligible assets according to the investment policy of the Sub-Fund. The Sub-Fund will mainly invest in transferable securities issued by issuers from OECD member states and denominated in any currency





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## Monthly Commentary

We saw a rebound at the end of March, but the market has been trading in lateral towards the end of April. The bullish trend is fading, some consolidation is taking place.

We reduced our equity exposure, realizing profits and decided to keep a maximum equity exposure of 10 to 15 % of NAV until we have more visibility on the global situation (more information on virus, easing of lockdowns around the world).

We think we will have more visibility in June or July. The markets have discounted the recovery and we do not have a high confidence in the current bullish trend.

More specifically in equity, we reduced our exposure to technology and healthcare, given the good ride they enjoyed, taking the valuation to expensive levels. We switched towards more conservative sectors, cheaper companies.

In fixed income we maintain a short duration, no change compared to previous month. We focus our investments in high grade USD bonds, mostly government debt. We stay away from high yield at the moment.

In currencies, we keep a 100% hedge of our USD exposure to limit risk in the portfolio, we prefer to focus our risk exposure in equity. We believe the situation in Europe is worse than in the US, and we entertain the possibility to reduce the hedge and go long USD.

Over the month of April 2020, the Fund's H Share returned 1.11%.

## Glossary

- **Absolute return:** the return that an asset achieves over a certain period of time. This measure looks at the appreciation or depreciation, expressed as a percentage, that an asset, such as a stock or a mutual fund, achieves over a given period of time.

- **CME:** Chicago Mercantile Exchange

- **Delta:** The ratio of the change in price of an option to the change in price of the underlying asset. Also called the hedge ratio. Applies to derivative products

- **Exposure:** the dollar amount of funds, or percentage of a portfolio, invested in a particular type of security, market sector or industry, which is usually expressed as a percentage of total portfolio holdings

- **Fed monetary policy:** what the U.S. Federal Reserve, the nation's central bank, does to influence the amount of money and credit in the U.S. economy. What happens to money and credit affects interest rates (the cost of credit) and the performance of the U.S. economy

- **Fixed income:** a type of investment whose return is usually fixed or predictable and is paid at a regular frequency like annually, semi-annually, quarterly or monthly

- **Hedge:** an investment to reduce the risk of adverse price movements in an asset, normally consisting of taking an offsetting position in a related security

- **High Water Mark:** the highest peak in value that an investment fund or account has reached, in the context of fund manager compensation, which is performance-based

- **Long/short position:** an investing strategy that takes long positions in stocks that are expected to appreciate and short positions in stocks that are expected to decline

- **Max DD:** A maximum drawdown is the maximum observed loss from a peak to a trough of a portfolio, before a new peak is attained.

- **Put:** an option contract giving the owner the right, but not the obligation, to sell a specified amount of an underlying asset at a set price within a specified time

- **Style-agnostic approach:** Style refers to the investment approach or objective that a fund manager uses. In this type of approach, the investment manager is not limited by specific style

- **Valuation:** the process of determining the current worth of an asset or a company, by looking into different aspects such as the business's management, the composition of its capital structure, the prospect of future earnings, and the market value of its assets

- **VaR:** is a means of measuring the potential loss to a Sub-Fund due to market risk and is expressed as the maximum potential loss at a 99% confidence level over a one month time horizon

- **VIX:** Chicago Board Options Exchange Volatility Index, used by stock and options traders to gauge the market's anxiety level

- **Volatility:** a statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given security or market index. Commonly, the higher the volatility, the riskier the security.
